

June is always a glorious month for us. We find out if all our hard work of writing grants back in February paid off. Well, not only did it pay off, we received over seven Library Services Technology Act grants! The most we have ever received! I talk about this a lot, grants are not an easy thing to write. There is a process and guidelines that we must adhere to. I couldn't be more proud of our librarians and their dedication to our community and focusing on our key priorities.

One of the largest grants will be used to create a "Tween Space," which focuses on kids between the ages of 9-13. During our community assessment, this was a service gap we weren't addressing. Our middle schoolers use our library but feel out of place in the Children's area and are too young for our Teen area.

We are excited to order materials, furniture, and other cool gear for our Tweens to give them the space and programming they want to continue their library journey with us.

Programming for all grants will start in the fall. In the meantime, get ready for Summer Reading 2021, Tails and Tales! We look forward to seeing kids, teens and adults return for summer reading and all the fun activities we have planned.



LIBRARY NEWS

Prescott Valley Public Library (PVPL) was recently awarded 7 grants totaling \$54,000 through the Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA) and the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS), administered by the Arizona State Library, Archives and Public Records.

The \$30,000 Tween Space grant will provide an inclusive area for library patrons aged 9 to 13 years old, including furniture, collections, and resources. The Tween department also received a \$4000 STEM-based grant titled "Takey-Takey Makey-Makey" in which the library will provide take-and-make coding kits and programming that will inspire ingenuity and investigation.


The \$4000 STEAM Explosion grant allows the library to expand its collection and programming for children under 9 years old in areas of science, technology, engineering, art, and math. College and Career Exploration is a \$4000 grant offering straightforward and accessible college and career readiness programs and resources for teens and will cover topics in college preparation, career exploration, and adulting skills.


PVPL will continue our hotspot lending service with the \$4000 Wi-Fi
Hotspot Lending grant which combines hotspots with Chromebooks in our
Stay Connected Kits. Our Go Virtual grant, \$4000, will allow us to purchase
an iMac and editing software and provide programming focusing on
creating, editing, and sharing virtual content. The Grow and Create grant
and its \$4000 in funds will be used to set up a seed library and related
classes that will complement the library's already popular and successful
food pantry.

Instructions to get the app are below. HAVE FUN!






HIGHLIGHTS CHILDREN & TWEENS (9 - 13)




CHILDREN'S

Doodleville, by Chad Sell, is a fantastic graphic novel set in a world where art *literally* comes to life. Drew, a young artist, loves her doodles; she's had them since she was a child, and they usually live in Doodleville -- a massive city drawn on a piece of butcher paper -- or in her sketchbook, which she takes with her everywhere even to art museums, where they break out of her sketchbook and wreak havoc with the other art.

This isn't the first time Drew's doodles have gotten her into trouble, and it certainly won't be the last.

When her latest drawing -- a GIANT leviathan monster escapes and starts causing serious trouble in Doodleville and beyond, Drew has to call upon her fellow artist friends to set things right.

All of them will have to work together to tame this beast and return order to Doodleville, once and for all.
