


Scooby Apocalypse Vol. 1

In this more mature take on Scooby Doo, the Mystery Inc crew try to solve their biggest mystery yet, how did nearly everyone in the world get turned into monsters, and can they ever find a cure? Scooby can talk, but only because he was a subject for secret experiments by scientists that may have also caused the apocalypse. A fun and compelling new spin on classic characters with great art.

In "The Martian," astronaut Mark Watney gets left behind on Mars when his crew thinks he has died in an accident. He must survive using his ingenuity, and he keeps diary entries along the way. Meanwhile, on Earth, NASA has realized he's still alive from a satellite image and are working feverishly to rescue him. Surprisingly, this book is absolutely hilarious! Fans of all genres will enjoy this book: comedy, science/technology/math non-fiction (note: you do not need to understand these concepts to enjoy the book), science fiction, adventure... The list goes on. Also, the audiobook version is fantastic and won an Audie Award.
