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DIRECTOR'S CUT by Casey Van Haren

Back in 2013, I wrote a Library Services Technology Act (LSTA) grant for the library to revamp the Virtual Reality Room. I asked for \$30,000 to update computers, purchase video recording equipment, and an instructor to teach classes. I was awarded full funding. Since then, our library has applied for and received over \$151,605.00 in funds through the Arizona State Library, Archives and Public Records.

Not a lot of people know that libraries throughout the United States rely on this funding through the Institute of Museums and Library Services (IMLS), which includes LSTA grants. IMLS was established in 1996 to support libraries and museums to sustain lifelong learning and cultural heritage. These funds allow libraries to promote early literacy, digital literacy, STEM, art, inclusive and accessible learning, innovation and critical thinking.

In just this last year, Michele Hjorting, our Adult Services Lead Librarian, has applied for and received over \$40,000 in LSTA grant funding. Writing grants is not an easy job. There are strict guidelines that must be followed throughout the grant process and at the end of the grant we must write the final report before the deadline. In this report we need to justify the success of the grant and include data, feedback from those who have participated in the programs, and we must spend all grant funds on time. It is a time-consuming process and does not include the time spent preparing and implementing programming.

Because of these funds our community has been able to check out Wi-Fi hotspots, attend computer and art classes, attend cultural and civic events, talk to a vetted business counselor, and assist those with obtaining their citizenship. These grant funds help our community grow and thrive and we will continue to expand our services and support 21st century skills.




STAFF SUGGESTIONS

Two children's picture book stories set after WWII and based on real events illustrate how seeds of friendship can grow.



What's inside so delights Katje that she sends off a letter of thanks: beginning an exchange that swells with so many surprises that the girls, as well as their townspeople, will never be the same.





Another book, Mercedes and the
Chocolate Pilot, by Margot Raven is the
true story of a young German girl, Mercedes
Simon, and the American pilot, Gail Halvorsen,
who shared hope and joy with the children of
West Berlin by dropping candy-filled
parachutes during the Berlin Airlift.
