DIRECTOR'S CUT by Casey Van Haren

It's July, a month we think of celebrating our nation's independence with family get-togethers, barbecues and fireworks, yet we still have a long and uncertain road ahead of us. Businesses are trying to recover from the shutdown, families may have not seen one another in months and many are struggling financially.

The shutdown caused the Town to take a conservative approach to budgeting and stop unnecessary spending. This has affected the Library greatly, as we cannot spend funds on new materials. As a result, we lean heavily on our Friends of the Library (FOL). Our FOL group helps support the Library as our 501(c)3, and raises funds so we can purchase materials, supplies and even pay for professional development for staff. This is a great organization that advocates for us and always helps us. The shutdown of the Library greatly affected the sales that were being brought in by the book store, which produces most of their income. We were also supposed to have our spring book sale in April, and that had to be cancelled. Our FOL is trying to make up as much of the difference as possible, but are in desperate need of new donations and funds.

There a couple of options for how you can help out our FOL and the Library:

- Make a direct donation by mailing a check made out to the Friends of the Prescott Valley Public Library (7401 E Skoog Blvd, Prescott Valley, AZ 86314) or put a check/cash in an envelope addressed to FOL and drop it at the front Information Desk.
- Get or renew a FOL individual membership for \$5, \$10 for a family, or \$100 for one person for life. A form is available at the front Information Desk.
- Shop at the **Friends Bookstore**. FOL plans to have a store-wide sale beginning on July 6th. Most items will be 25¢, 50¢ and \$1.


