



Bix is an incredibly nervous goblin -- she's responsible for looking after her little sister, Pella, and it is *not* an easy job. Pella is fearless, impulsive, and always getting into mischief. This makes things very difficult for Bix, who is consumed with fear over Pella's antics.

To make matters worse, the underground goblin city is besieged by increasingly violent earth tremors caused by Earth Queen. The council decides it's time for everyone to move, but Pella disagrees. She thinks it's time to find the Earth Queen and give her what for! Even if it means traveling through the Enchanted Forest.

Bix is distraught when she realizes her little sister has gone into the Enchanted Forest. Everyone knows how dangerous it is! No goblin who enters ever comes back! (Hence the title of the graphic novel.)


