The Arizona State Library, Archives and Public Records, a division of the Secretary of State, has awarded a \$4,285.71 grant to the Prescott Valley Public Library to purchase and lend WI-FI Hotspots to library patrons.

We are very excited to be able to offer this valuable free service to our community. This pilot program is an opportunity for our library to provide 24/7 internet access, which can assist students, job seekers or those in need of reliable internet.

- Patrons will be able to check out devices with a valid YLN library card in good standing.
- ♦ Patrons must be 18 years or older.
- One hot-spot per household.
- ♦ Lending period will be 4 weeks.
- ♦ Hotspots can only be checked out at PVPL and must be returned to PVPL.

Well, if you go to our webpage at <u>pvlib.net</u> and click on "ebooks & More", you'll find after you click on the link that there are e-books, audiobooks and e-magazines. Under RB Digital, there are over 275 magazines that you can peruse for free!

You do need to create an account using your library card and PIN. From there, you can immediately access the current or back issues of any magazine offered. There is a table of contents and featured article titles, just like in a print magazine. There is no due date. I like the fact that you can read the magazine on a regular computer for large pages/pictures or on a mobile device if you get stuck at the doctor's office! If you're like me, one magazine leads to another. . . just like books! Now if there was just a magazine on how to spend the day reading while getting things done - wait, we have hundreds of audiobooks. . .
