Legacy Donors

Prescott Valley Public Library is the center of the community and the center for free exchange of information, which is vital to our democracy. Our community is very enthusiastic about supporting what we do, be it early literacy, large festivals like Fandomania, arts and cultural programs, Monday Night movies, computer classes and so much more, all for free.

In the last 10 years, we have benefited tremendously from legacy donors, people who have included the Prescott Valley Public Library in their estate plans because they believe in the importance of literature and reading, access to information, and the promotion of cultural awareness. Two years ago we received a donation from the Joe and Hertha Koole estate and placed this gift in an endowment fund to continue to grow for future use.

Why are legacy donors important?

Funds from legacy donors help us provide updated and needed technology, early literacy programs, enriched library collections and services. By including Friends of the Prescott Valley Public Library, a 501c(3), in your estate planning provides an indispensable source of support for the exceptional difference the library can make in our community. We used legacy funds of \$973,000 from the McBride family to purchase the opening day collection in 2009. Recently, Prescott Valley resident, Erika Schneider, pledged to add the Friends in her will. Schneider suggests that others do the same to help better the lives of our community now and into the future.

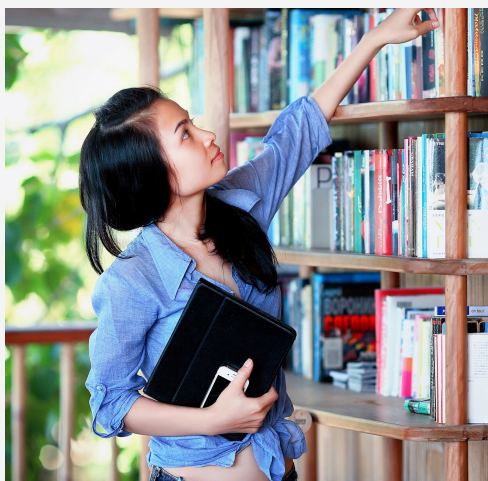
We are looking for someone to help lead a Chess Class one hour a week for a month.

The Arizona Treasure Hunter

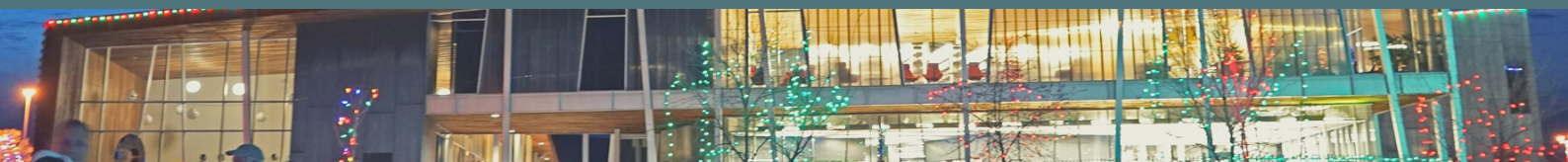

This program is free. No registration is required.

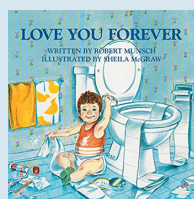

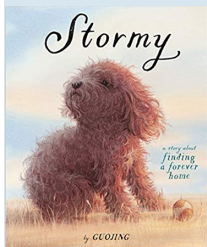


STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS

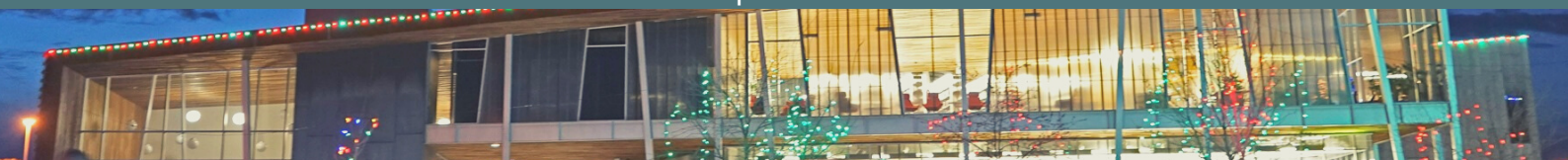

Potential program participants or volunteers should call Shannon at 928-759-6186. We want to make sure every resident of the Town of Prescott Valley has access to the Library!

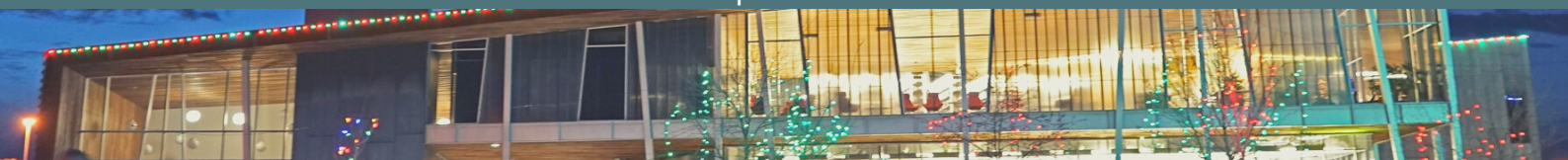
Friends of the Prescott Valley Public Library February Green Dot Booksale

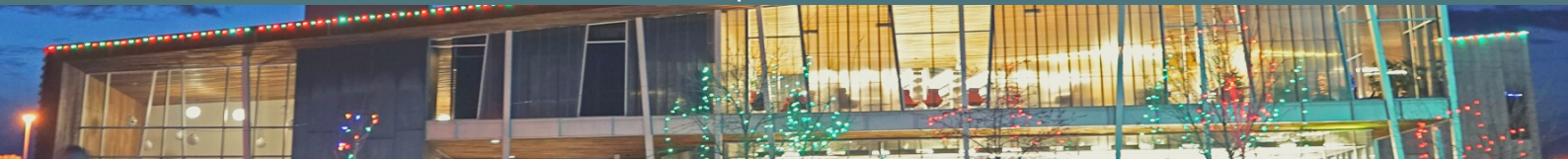

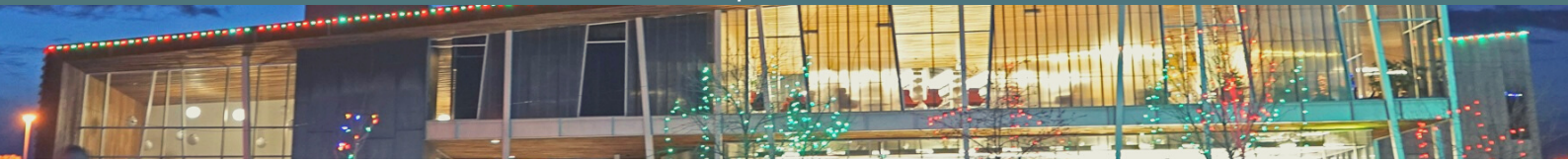

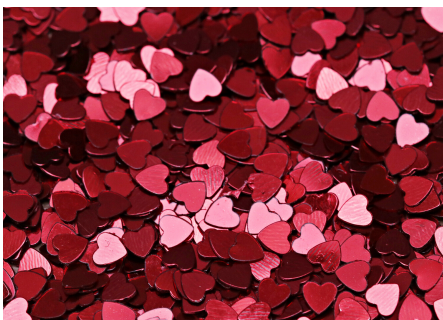
