




Director's Cut by Casey Van Haren

However, the good news is we have hired a new Teen Librarian! We are very excited to welcome Jeff Howick to the Teen Department. Jeff is fun, brilliant, and passionate about working with Teens and his community. Jeff started at PVPL as a volunteer a few years ago. He began working on his Master's in Library Science right around the time he was hired on as a Library Assistant in the Children's Department. He will be finishing up his degree and graduating in just a few weeks, just in time to start his new position here in 'Teen' to prepare for the kick-off for this year's Summer Reading Program (starting on June 1). Come on by and say hello.

What is an I.L.L?

What is an I.L.L. you ask? It stands for Interlibrary Loan and this is a free service. When you search for a book in our Yavapai Library Network (YLN), if you don't find what you are looking for, we have a link on our homepage on the left that says, "Request an Interlibrary Loan". You can fill out the form and the ILL staff person will research across the United States for a library willing to loan it for free. We also reciprocate in this program. When the form is submitted, if the item is in the system, up to 6 libraries will be contacted, in order of closest to farthest, and each library will have up to 8 days to respond. If their copy is not available, they decline and the request goes to the next library. If no libraries have the item or can't lend it, you receive a call that the item is not available. This process may take 4-6 weeks, so be patient! If the item is not in the system free of charge, you will be notified.
