The second week in April, libraries from all over the United States celebrate National Library Week. During this week, we look back at all the contributions libraries and their staff have made in supporting communities, education and lifelong learning. Libraries equal strong communities and help to revitalize struggling neighborhoods and downtown areas. According to the Pew Research Center, "Most Americans view public libraries as important parts of their community..." and further, believe that if their local library were to close, it would hurt communities.

We celebrate our staff within this week with National Library Workers Day on Tuesday April 9th. Library staff are the cornerstone of what makes our library so successful. We have 26 employees who are dedicated to providing the best service, programs, events and technology assistance. Staff share their expertise to change lives and provide support.

For example, let me tell you about Joe. Joe was recently laid off from his job. He had been a welder for over 30 years. That's all he has ever known. He called unemployment and they told him to go online and apply for his benefits and start looking for jobs. He said he didn't have a computer and had no idea how to do this. Currently, 16% of Americans are computer illiterate. He turned around deflated and told his wife. She stated, "Go to the library, they have computers and can help you." Joe came in and talked to a staff person at the library who guided him through the process. Staff signed him up for basic computer classes and he met, one on one, with a librarian weekly to help him fill out applications and to create a resume. Joe came back a few months later elated and told staff he found a job. He was almost in tears and said we saved his life. Libraries transform lives. This is just one of hundreds of stories we have about the impact staff and the library has had on someone's life.










#### **Volunteer Corner News**
